TRANSITIONING TO A NEW LEARNING TEAM

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

To support those students who are transitioning from one Learning Team to another, we are continuing this year with our normal transition process.

The details are outlined below:

Beginning of Week 10 (Monday 8th December): End of Year reports are emailed home, along with a 2026 Class Placement Letter, Overall School Organisation document and Stationery List.

Tuesday 9th December: Students have the opportunity to spend time in their new classroom from 1.45pm, with their new teacher and students who are not transitioning. They will meet their teacher and get to know a little bit about how things are done in that room.

Evening of same day - parent 'Meet the Teacher' evening. This will enable parents to meet their child's new teacher and hear about the new Learning Team. To cater for people who may have children transitioning to 2 new teams the timing is as follows:

4.30pm: Kākano Learning Team (Years 0-2) Room 2

5:00pm: Tinaku Learning Team (Years 3 & 4) Room 6

5:30pm: Māhuri Learning Team (Years 5 & 6) Room 9

6:00pm: Rākau Learning Team (Year 7 & 8) Room 14 (Hall)

There will be an opportunity to hear from the Team Leaders and teachers, followed by time to speak with individual teachers.

We're confident this process will allay any fears students may or may not have about the unknown, and make for a happy holiday and a positive start to next year.

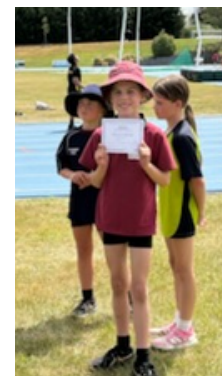
